COMMUNITY PARTNER:

- KAPAHULU CENTER – Serves Senior Citizen and low-income neighborhood for 27 years
- 501(c)(3) organization since 1996
- Provides educational, recreational and physical support service

KAPAHULU CENTER HISTORY

- Waikiki Japanese Elementary School opened in 1909 at this location
- Building is over 100 years old and needs repair and renovation
- Merged with Kapahulu Center in 2004
 - Transferred all assets to Center, including the building

TWO MAJOR ACTIVITIES OF GRANT

- **RENOVATION OF KITCHEN –**
CREATE A CULINARY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION CLASSROOM
- **PROGRAM AND SERVICES –** DEVELOP AND OFFER CLASSES IN NUTRITION, HEALTH AND FITNESS, PUBLIC SAFETY, JOB TRAINING, and ECONOMIC SELF-SUFFICIENCY













DEVELOP MORE PROGRAMS FOR CENTER

HEALTH and FITNESS

- NUTRITION CLASSES & DEMONSTRATION
- EXERCISE CLASSES, YOGA, DANCE, ETC.
- COMPUTER CLASSES – internet and e-mail classes to keep in touch with children
- FINANCIAL LITERACY – financial planning, and entrepreneurship
